When you graduate from ICSE you join a long list of past students.

The security industry values integrity, honesty and professionalism above all else.

All our courses are built around these common values.

Acting in a way that is consistent with these values, benefits everyone in our community.

Academic honesty is the minimum we expect from all our learners.

A learner who attempts to cheat on an assessment does not have the integrity, honesty and professionalism we look for in the security industry.

A learner who attempts to cheat on an assessment, will not pass the course and as a result is not able to attain a licence.

As an Approved Training Provider with the Private Security Authority all information on any misconduct is sent to the Private Security Authority and any relevant bodies.

Students need to be familiar with the Student Conduct Code. The Code is available for review in the ICSE learner handbook.

Academic misconduct includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- Disclosing exam content during or after you have taken an exam.
- Taking a screen shot at any time during training, delivery or assessment.
- Copying any material from another student or from another source such as the Internet, that is submitted for grading.
- Plagiarism, including use of Internet material without proper citation.
- Using cell phones, search facilities online, or other electronics to obtain outside information during an exam or assessment.
- Submitting someone else's own work as part of an assessment.
- Having someone else complete any aspect of an assessment on your behalf.
